

# BREA BEAD WORKS

## RIBBON WEAVE BRACELET

### MATERIALS

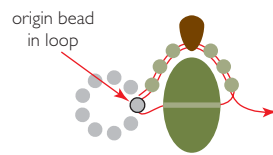
- ▷ Faceted donut bead; 6x9mm [21 qty]
- ▷ Drop bead; 4mm [21 qty]
- ▷ Seed bead; 11° [1 tube]
- ▷ Clasp of your choice
- ▷ Jump rings; 6mm open [2 qty]
- ▷ Fireline thread; 6 lb

### TOOLS

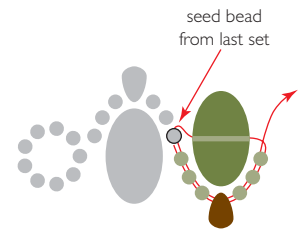
- ▷ Beading needle; size 12
- ▷ Scissors



**1.** Thread beading needle with 4-5 feet of Fireline thread. String on nine seed beads and form loop by passing thread back through all seed beads, leaving a six inch tail of thread. Tie a square knot to secure (Fig A) and pass thread through neighboring seed bead (Fig B).



**2.** String on 3 seed beads, drop bead, 3 seed beads, and donut bead. Pass thread back through the origin seed bead in loop as well as the 3 seed beads, drop bead, and 3 seed beads just strung.

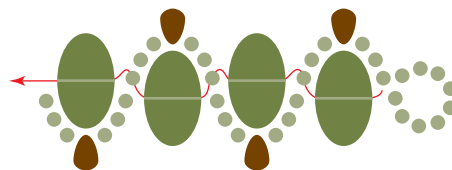


**3.** String on 3 seed beads, drop bead, 3 seed beads, and donut bead. Pass thread back through last seed bead from last set plus 3 seed beads, drop bead, and 3 seed beads just strung.

Repeat this step until you have reached your desired length. Remember that you still have to incorporate your clasp which will add about an inch to the length.

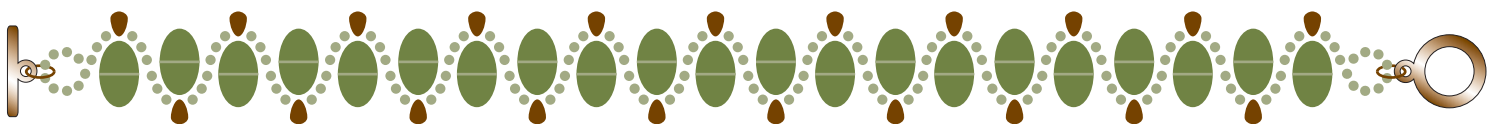


**4.** When you've reached your length, string on 9 seed beads and pass thread through seed bead from last set to form a loop. Pass thread through again for strength.



**5.** Pass thread back through donut beads and bridging seed beads to strengthen bracelet.

Tie half-hitched knots in several locations to secure. Pass thread through a few more beads and trim thread. Do the same for the tail of thread end.



**6.** Attach clasp to seed bead loops at end using open jump rings.
